IMPLEMENTERS Ignites Bold Climate Conversations with Climate Forward Summit




At a time when climate change threatens the very foundations of our health, livelihoods. and the future of our planet, conversations on climate action are more urgent than ever. Yet too often, these discussions happen in silos, without all the key players at the table. Recognising this critical gap. IMPLEMENTERS convened maiden its Climate Forward Summit on July 31, in partnership with Swiss Contact Ghana, CAMFED, Miniplast, Twellium, Ecorefix, and Eazytagg Technologies.

This first-of-its-kind summit served as a unifying platform, bringing together diverse climate stakeholders in governance, business, academia, agriculture, extractives, and civil society. High-level representatives from the Ministry of State in charge of Climate Change and Sustainability and the Ministry of Energy and Green Transition joined voices with industry leaders and grassroots actors to align vision, sector, and strategy for a more coordinated climate response.

Through thought-provoking presentations

and dialogue, participants explored Ghana's national climate strategy, the role of corporate social responsibility in delivering sustainable solutions, and opportunities to create synergies across sectors. The summit highlighted not only the urgency of the climate crisis but also the potential for bold, cross-sector action to drive solutions.



Beyond discussions, the summit also shone a spotlight climate leadership, on celebrating organisations whose actions are setting new benchmarks. AngloGold Ashanti received the Climate Leadership Recognition Award, Twellium Industrial Company Ltd was honoured as a Climate Forward Ally, and CAMFED recognised for was its Innovative Climate Solution.



For IMPLEMENTERS, the Climate Forward Summit is a reflection of our mission to design and deliver solutions that build stronger, climate-resilient communities. We believe that the path to a climate-resilient Ghana must be built together, and this Summit is our commitment to making sure no voice is left behind.

Woriyanga Welcomes Yamoransa Model Lab 15

Woriyanga, like many other communities in Ghana, faces significant educational challenges, with limited access to digital tools and comprehensive STEM education.

Recognising this urgent need, the Minister of State for Public Sector Reforms and MP for Tempane Constituency, Hon. Lydia Lamisi Akanvariba, together with the **Africa** Foundation, Helping IMPLEMENTERS. committed and other partners, joined forces to change the narrative by establishing the Yamoransa Model Lab 15 in Woriyanga in the Upper East Region to create a more inclusive pathway for practical STEAM education.

Yamoransa Model Labs initiative The bridges the digital divide by providing underserved communities with access to modern technology and practical STEAM education. The Yamoransa Model Lab 15, which was successfully dedicated September 6th, is the 16th of its kind in Ghana. The dedication had in attendance stakeholders, educators. students. members of the Tempane community at the forefront of the YM Lab 15 building to celebrate this momentous achievement. This ultramodern facility features two 36seater Edulabs equipped with cutting-edge technology, AR/VR tools, 3D printing

capabilities, a Maker Space dedicated to robotics, a conference room, and gender and disability-friendly washrooms.

More than just a physical space, this lab will transform how teachers teach and how students learn, equipping young people with the digital and technological skills needed to thrive in the 21st century. The dedication of Lab 15 is proof that strategic partnerships can dismantle systemic barriers, narrow the digital divide, and provide underserved communities with the same educational and technological opportunities as their more privileged peers.

With the Helping Africa Foundation funding the lab's technological resources, Hon. Akanvariba financing the infrastructure, and IMPLEMENTERS and TECHAiDE leading on project management and technical support, respectively, Lab 15 stands in Woriyanga as a powerful symbol of what is possible when vision, commitment, and partnership come together.

At IMPLEMENTERS, stories like Woriyanga reaffirm our mission: that every child, regardless of where they are born, deserves the chance to learn, create, and succeed.

IMPLEMENTERS Leads the Management of the Kafui Prebbie Foundation's KP@50 Celebration



Again this year, IMPLEMENTERS proudly led the management of the Kafui Prebbie Foundation's (KPF) initiative, flagship the Vision Project, which continues empower underprivileged individuals through access healthcare, educational assistance, and entrepreneurship support. The celebration was made even more special as it marked the 50th milestone of our CEO, Mr. Kafui Prebbie.

The Kafui Prebbie Foundation, the corporate social responsibility arm of the PREBBIE Group (of which IMPLEMENTERS is a part), designed this celebration as an opportunity to extend impact and reaffirm our collective mission of transforming lives.

Held on 12th August 2025 at the University of Ghana's School of Engineering, the Vision Project brought together beneficiaries from five KPF-supported orphanages: Nyame Dua Orphanage Home, Methodist Rafiki Satellite Village, Mayfair School, Great Mission International School, and the Teshie Children's Home Annex.

The day was filled with exciting and educational activities aimed at equipping children and caregivers with practical skills, knowledge, and inspiration. As part of the programme, we held a menstrual health training session with our







partner, Reflo Sanitary Pads, to empower young girls and their caregivers with the confidence and knowledge to manage their periods with dignity. To further support this effort, Reflo Sanitary Pads and the KPF Foundation donated a year-long supply of sanitary pads to the participating orphanages. We also organised an engaging, hands-on session featuring Dext Technology's TECHAiDE's Science Kits and ASANKA platform, providing both training and donations to help spark curiosity in STEM and digital learning among the children.

To crown the celebration, beneficiaries toured the School of Engineering, giving them a first-hand look at what their futures could hold. Through strong partnerships with Reflo Sanitary Pads, Dext Technologies, and the Dr. Elsie Effah Kaufmann Foundation, the Vision Project became a truly inspiring experience, one that connected young dreams with real opportunities for the future.

Strengthening the Yamoransa Model in Liberia: A Path to Sustainable Impact

In August, IMPLEMENTERS, together with the Helping Africa Foundation (HAF), undertook a monitoring visit and stakeholder engagement in Liberia. This mission was a step toward strengthening the impact of the Yamoransa Model (YM) Lab Program while exploring new opportunities for expansion and long-term sustainability.

During the visit, our team met key stakeholders. includina government ministries: the Ministry of Gender, the Ministry of Education, and the Ministry of Information, as well as development partners such as the Rotary Club of Liberia and the JJ Roberts Foundation. conversations centred on building strategic partnerships, securing official endorsement. and laving foundation for long-term support that will ensure the YM Lab Program thrives in Liberia.

At the heart of the discussions was the review of the YM Lab hosted at the JJ Roberts Foundation, alongside brainstorming partnership models and innovative funding strategies. Looking ahead, active engagement with stakeholders will remain key to aligning goals, mobilising resources, and ensuring that the YM Model continues to effectively respond to both national and community education needs. Through these partnerships with government and other organisations, IMPLEMENTERS and HAF commit to ensuring the YM Model stays rooted in the real needs of communities and national priorities.


Strengthening Ghana's Climate Resilience through Stakeholder Collaboration



IMPLEMENTERS. we believe that tackling climate change is not only an environmental imperative but also pathway to safeguarding livelihoods. protecting communities, and securing a sustainable future for generations to come. In line with this commitment, we organised engagement stakeholder on Implementers Strategic Sector Research (ISSR) on Climate Change, in collaboration with Swisscontact Ghana.

The engagement created a platform for dialogue, knowledge-sharing, and collective alignment of efforts towards accelerating climate action in Ghana. It brought together a diverse range of participants, including academia, communications professionals, renewable energy experts, researchers, governance actors, and women- and youth-led organisations.

The objectives of the interaction focused on building a clear understanding of Ghana's climate change landscape. This included mapping kev stakeholders ongoing initiatives within the sector, identifying existing gaps, needs, and new opportunities for action, gaining insights into funder priorities and emerging climate finance trends, and exploring strategies for data access, innovation, and collaboration to drive more effective climate solutions.





The session was both insightful and solutions-driven, highlighting innovative strategies for building climate-resilient systems and reducing environmental harm at both local and national levels. One of the most important takeaways was the enthusiasm and commitment expressed by all stakeholders that collaboration is the cornerstone of progress and that no single actor can solve the climate challenge alone.

We remain optimistic about the future of climate change in Ghana. Together with our partners and stakeholders, we are determined to shape a climate-resilient Ghana where communities can thrive despite the challenges of a rapidly changing environment.



IMPLEMENTERS Joins Partners to Empower Africa's Youth Through Green Innovation

On September 12, IMPLEMENTERS joined partners of the Young Green Entrepreneurs (YGE) Programme, an initiative led by the Strategic Youth Network for Development (SYND) that supports young innovators in building sustainable green businesses across Africa, to co-organise the African Youth Conference at the La Palm Royal Beach Hotel in Accra.

The conference was held against the backdrop of a growing concern that many young people in Africa remain unemployed despite the continent's immense potential. The African Youth Conference seeks to change this reality by promoting innovative, inclusive, and sustainable pathways for young people to lead in green entrepreneurship, climate action, and natural resource governance.

This year's edition, themed "Building the Green Economy: Entrepreneurial Pathways for African Youth in a Just Transition," was held in collaboration with the Ministry of State for



Climate Change and Sustainability at the Office of the President of Ghana. It brought together hundreds of participants from across Africa, including young entrepreneurs, policymakers, and development stakeholders, for a day of fireside chats and panel discussions.

Speaking on behalf of IMPLEMENTERS, Daniel Ntiamoah Danguah. Senior Partnerships Associate, highlighted our organisation's role as a catalyst for youth empowerment, innovation, entrepreneurship within the green economy. He reaffirmed IMPLEMENTERS' position as a key partner within the YGE ecosystem. stressing the importance of collaboration in equipping young entrepreneurs with the skills, networks, and resources they need to scale their green businesses.



The African Youth Conference amplified the growing conversation around youth-led climate solutions and sustainable development. The insights gained and partnerships forged will directly shape our future initiatives as we continue to empower young Africans to become green innovators and changemakers. Together with our partners, we remain committed to building an Africa where equitable opportunities and a thriving, sustainable future go hand in hand.
